Lexington, Va. – Sigma Nu Fraternity has learned from media reports today that charges have been made in Oconee County, S.C. against three Clemson University students in connection with the December death of Benjamin Sprague.

“We respect the responsibility of law enforcement officials to pursue criminal charges. We will take this new information into consideration as we continue to work with University officials to complete our joint investigation and make decisions regarding the future of the Sigma Nu Chapter at Clemson University,” said Executive Director Brad Beacham.

Beacham added that all activities of the Theta Zeta Chapter remain suspended by the Fraternity and University until further notice.

The Theta Zeta Chapter of Sigma Nu Fraternity was founded at Clemson University in 1970.

Headquartered in Lexington, Va., Sigma Nu Fraternity was founded in 1869 at Virginia Military Institute in Lexington and currently has nearly 180 active chapters and colonies on college campuses throughout North America.
