STATEMENT FOR RELEASE

Lexington, Va. – Sigma Nu Fraternity, Inc. was informed yesterday that Robert “Chase” Campbell, a 20-year-old student at the University of South Carolina, was found dead Wednesday morning after a tragic accident. The Fraternity’s Delta Chapter at the University of South Carolina initiated Chase in November 2006.

“Chase's death came as a shock to all of us,” said Chapter Commander (President) Graydon McNair. “Not only was he an amazing friend to all who knew him, he was a loyal and dedicated Sigma Nu brother. He worked tirelessly for the betterment of our Chapter and the entire Greek Community.”

“At this point in time, we have no indication to believe that this tragic accident was a chapter-related activity,” said Executive Director Brad Beacham. “The Fraternity's thoughts, prayers and support are with Mr. Campbell’s family and our Delta Chapter brothers in the wake of this sudden and tragic loss.”

The General Fraternity will continue to work with University officials to provide support to our student members at South Carolina.

Headquartered in Lexington, Va., Sigma Nu Fraternity was founded in 1869 at Virginia Military Institute in Lexington and currently has over 180 active chapters and colonies on college campuses throughout North America.
