Relationship Agreements

With the beginning of a new calendar year quickly approaching, many universities may begin asking their fraternities to execute the 2011 relationship statement and/or relationship agreement. Increasingly, universities are requiring chapter officers to execute a contract stipulating the expectations of the University and the Greek community.

In some rare cases, these contracts may contain language that is contrary to Fraternity policy. Primarily, the conflict is with the insurance language contained in the relationship statement/agreement and may place unwarranted liability on the collegiate chapter.

As with any contract the chapter is asked to execute, the chapter's Commander should email the contract, prior to signing, to Fred Dobry, Director of Risk Reduction. at fred.dobry@sigmanu.org. This will ensure that the Fraternity's policies and insurance coverage do not conflict with the University's expectations.

Officer Transitions

It's that time of year again where many of our chapters begin the important process of electing new officers. While each member attempts to convince their chapter they are fit to lead, the outgoing officers get to watch with some amusement, as they know better than anyone that those nominated don't *really* know what they're getting themselves into until they're already in it.

Of course, anyone running for a position should do the necessary research, so as to learn the expectations and duties associated with that position. You wouldn't go into a job interview not knowing what it entails and why you would be qualified. Thus, all those running for a certain officer position should read the respective Officer Manual and browse the Officer Resource Web Page.

However, nothing beats job experience, and it is the responsibility of the outgoing officers to pass down that institutional knowledge to the new leadership. Fortunately, there is a LEAD Session designed for officer transitions. Ensure the lessons of the past are taught to the future by scheduling this session shortly following elections. Lastly, the officer transition checklist is another valuable resource to assist in this process.

Chapter House Winter Break Checklist

The semester is wrapping up and everyone is getting ready to go home to spend some quality time with their families and enjoy the holiday season. As stressful as this time of the year may be with final exams and project deadlines, it is vital that the chapter does not neglect important maintenance items to ensure the chapter house stays in good shape over the winter break. Failure to do so can cost the chapter and/or local house corporation thousands of dollars in avoidable repairs.

Utilize the following checklist to prepare your chapter house for the upcoming winter break:

- Open the indoor faucets slightly to allow water to trickle as moving water does not freeze as easily.
- Ensure that someone is checking the interior and exterior of the facility regularly during the break. You can usually accomplish this by notifying your campus or local police department.
- As a chapter, clean the house before departing for break nobody wants to come home to a dirty house.
- Respond to any leaks promptly to mitigate damage and prevent further harm.
- Keep the furnace on and thermostat set at or above 68 degrees.
- Unplug all electronic devices televisions, computers, etc.
- Place additional insulation on exterior walls and windows.
- Insulate exterior doors appropriately, and assure all close and latch completely.
- Clear all snow and ice from sidewalks, fire escapes, and walkways and ensure someone is assigned this responsibility over the break.

The four leading risks to a chapter facility during holiday breaks are water freeze, fire, vandalism and theft. During the winter of 2008 - 2009, Willis North America (the Fraternity's insurance broker) handled 24 freeze claims that paid out more than half a million dollars.

There is no need for the chapter to return from the winter break to a damaged chapter house. Work with your local house corporation and college/university to ensure your chapter house is properly prepared for the winter break.
