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To Tag or Not To Tag- The Potential Risks of Social Media

Recently, I was reading a news report detailing the numerous corporate efforts being made to protect brand values and company images. I wasn't surprised to learn that almost all companies have introduced strict social networking policies for their employees. In fact, most companies now try to alleviate any PR nightmares by screening out the "ethically questionable" job candidates well before making an offer of employment. According to Careerbuilder.com, over 35% of employers reported they have found content on social networking sites that caused them to not hire a candidate.

This has direct relevance to Sigma Nu. We also have a brand to protect, and with hundreds of thousands of representations online, we are challenged with fighting that "frat boy" stereotype every time a brother posts. Since I work with college students all across the country, I can understand how tagging photos of you and your brothers' beer ponging the night away on Facebook can serve as a "badge of honor" which documents your journey into manhood. However, as Sigma Nus we have a greater Badge of Honor to protect. This will not only protect Sigma Nu, but will also protect each brother's integrity through a hiring process.

The following is a list of items you should consider having done during the summer break to help the house recover from another academic year of residency while also preparing the facility for the 2011-2012 year:

- Inspect all rooms/suites, document damage and collect payment from security deposits
- Repair all broken windows and doors to prevent damage; ensure that doors latch completely
- Inform the host institution (college/university) as to whether the residence will be occupied or not and provide proper contact information for the facility

If members will be attending school and living in the facility over the summer period:

- Have each sign a housing agreement, specific to the summer period
- If the appropriate chapter officers will not be living in the facility, appoint someone to oversee daily maintenance, collect rent and pay bills

If the chapter facility is unoccupied over the summer, make sure the following is completed:

- Securely lock the property and limit access to only designated alumni and/or undergraduates
- Have a responsible alumnus, undergraduate or professional property-management company check the property daily. A consistent daily presence will deter thieves and vandals
- Inform local police and/or campus security the property will not be occupied. Provide them with a key/code for access to the facility and ask them to patrol frequently
- When not in use, remove all hoses and store in an appropriate place, preferably inside the facility. Many vandalism claims involve placing a running hose near or in the house
