Alumni Spotlight: Will J. DeViney

fter graduating from the Univer-Asity of Idaho in May of 2016, Will DeViney, AO 1676 accepted a job at Sigma Nu Headquarters as the Expansion and Recruitment Consultant. Although DeViney earned a degree in Exercise Science and was accepted into three different Master's Programs, he could not pass up the opportunity to work for the fraternity which he feels gave him so much. 
