

2023 Rock Chapters

The Rock Chapter Award is the highest collegiate chapter honor. To be granted the award, a chapter should attain an ideal or nearly perfect state across a broad range of areas of fraternity operations for a consistent period of two-plus years. Rock Chapters consistently achieved very good to excellent ratings in the Pursuit of Excellence Program over the course of the biennium. Final selections also consider risk management, behavioral, financial, and other issues exhibited by chapters over the review period.

These chapters, should they maintain performance at their current levels, are anticipated to rise to the level of Rock Chapter in the subsequent biennium.
