



THE SOCIAL STRENGTHS WORKSHOP

The Social Strengths workshop is Sigma Nu's <u>award-winning</u> sexual assault, relational aggression, healthy relationships, and bystander intervention educational program for collegiate members. This two-hour workshop is presented by trained Sigma Nu staff members and delivered to Sigma Nu-specific collegiate audiences as part of the on-site consultations offered to each chapter and colony.

This interactive workshop introduces participants to the key strengths and standards needed to be a good student, citizen, and man of honor. Objectives of the facilitated program include helping students to:

- Establish buy-in on the standards and behaviors that ensure rising above harmful behaviors.
- Recognize that adopting and living by certain standards and behaviors will improve the quality of one's social life and relationships.
- Identify and recognize common rationalizations that can hinder a person's ability to understand social issues or to act morally and ethically in certain situations.
- Explain why certain "non-violent" situations are problematic.
- Articulate the superior alternative behavior or solution in problematic "non-violent" situations.
- Increase ability to recognize the seriousness of problematic situations.
- Increase confidence to know when and how to do something helpful in a problematic situation.

These important concepts are applicable across a wide range of areas of a student's life, particularly their relationships - including intimate and sexual situations. The curriculum and presentation include a blended focus on sexual assault and bystander intervention - a 75 to 25% split focus, respectively.

The Social Strengths Workshop was developed in partnership with Aaron Boe, M.S.Ed. Aaron is a specialist in non-stranger sexual assault, relational violence prevention, healthy relationships, and bystander intervention. Aaron is a professional speaker and trainer who has presented at AtixA/SCOPE, ACPA, INCASA, AFA, and is an appointee to ACPA's Presidential Task Force on Sexual Violence in Higher Education. Aaron is the principal of <u>Prevention Culture</u>, where he develops and delivers bystander intervention and sexual assault prevention keynotes and curriculum.
