What is Grand Chapter?

What is Grand Chapter?

A four-day, democratic legislative convention where representatives of the Fraternity's collegiate and alumni chapters and Grand Officers meet to determine the operational direction of the Fraternity for the next biennium (two-year period).


Following a postponement from 2020 to 2021 during the pandemic, the Grand Chapter is held in odd-numbered summers (the 71st Grand Chapter will be held in Summer 2025).

The 70th Grand Chapter was the first in-person Grand Chapter in five years (69th was virtual in 2021 and 68th was in Washington, D.C. in 2018).



Grand Chapter Resolutions

Recognitions of exceptional service to the Fraternity by distinguished Brothers and other contributors.

Continued work to ensure an "inclusive Brotherhood."

Review of the Alumni Advisory Board program.

70th Grand Chapter Amendments to <u>The Law</u>

- 1. Clarifying the role of Counsel in a Trial Code Hearing
- 2. Rock Chapter Award name and criteria update
- **3. Removing Bonding Requirements for Grand Treasurer, Executive Director, and Collegiate Chapter Treasurer**
- 4. Adoption of Risk Reduction Officer to Collegiate Chapter Officer Listing
- Authorizing the High Council to Implement Disciplinary Action Against an Alumnus Brother (until formal disciplinary action can be taken – i.e., Trial Code)
- 6. Permitting Election of High Council by Acclamation at Grand Chapter
- 7. Modifying Collegiate Chapter Approval Process (Colony Petition)
- 8. Collegiate Grand Councilman transition to Collegiate Board of Advisors

Collegiate Advisors

Each year outstanding Collegiate Brothers are selected to serve as advisors to both the High Council and Sigma Nu Educational Foundation's board of directors.

Announcement and description of these roles will be sent by email to all collegiate brothers late in the fall term.

Interested Brothers will apply and participate in an interview with representatives of the High Council / Foundation Board.

Brothers will be appointed to serve for a one-year term and will participate in all meetings of the High Council / Foundation Board.




